

# Uniform

Every child is expected to wear school uniform. Details of prices and sizes of Wareside uniform are available from the school office and are available from [School Trends](#). Other items are generally available from the normal shops or large retail clothing outlets.

Children will require separate footwear for P.E. (and break time if they want to play football etc). Children are not permitted to wear boots or trainers as part of their school uniform.	

## Footwear

The school wants children to grow into healthy adults. We believe it is dangerous for children to wear shoes that have platform soles, high heels, thin straps or are backless, so we do not allow children to wear such shoes in our school. We require all children to wear shoes as stated in the uniform list.

During break and lunchtimes Key Stage 1 & 2 children should change into outdoor footwear (e.g. trainers, wellies).

## Jewellery and hairstyles

On health and safety grounds we do not allow children to wear jewellery, nail varnish or make-up in school. The exceptions to this rule are earring studs or sleepers in pierced ears, analogue watches, and small objects of religious significance. We ask the children to either remove these objects during P.E., or cover them with a plaster (as appropriate), to prevent them from causing injury.

All long hair should be tied back during P.E. lessons. The school does not permit children to have extreme haircuts, styles or accessories that could serve as a distraction to themselves and/or the other children.

# Physical Education

On health and safety grounds we believe that it is important for children to change into the appropriate clothing and footwear for physical education, as follows:

## Nursery

Appropriate clothing

## Reception

Blue Wareside school t-shirt

Blue shorts

Black plimsolls

In Winter/Spring: jogging pants and sweatshirts must be worn for outdoor P.E.

## KS1 & KS2

Blue Wareside school t-shirt

Blue shorts

Trainers

In Winter/Spring: jogging pants and sweatshirts must be worn for outdoor P.E.

## Swimming

Towel

Girls: Swimsuit

Boys: trunks or close-fitting swimming shorts

Hair band to tie back long hair

Goggles only if children have reached 'Deep Water' standard or above. If they are needed for a specific medical reason a doctor's certificate will be required.

Spray deodorant, talcum powder, hair spray and hair gel are NOT permitted.

All items of uniform must be labelled with either nametapes, or indelible marker pen.

P.E. kit must be sent in a name-labelled drawstring bag for hanging on a peg.
